“Bhasha Sangam: Celebrating India’s Linguistic Harmony”



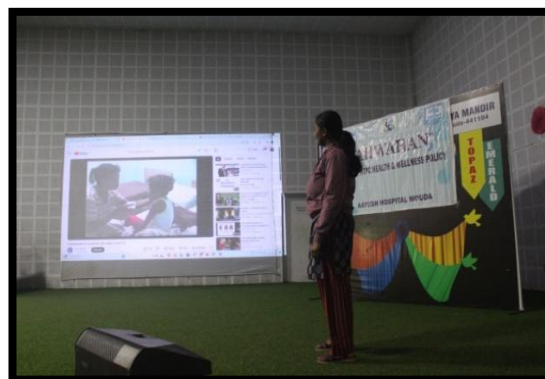
The school observed **Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav 2025** to mark the birth anniversary of Mahakavi Subramania Bharati.

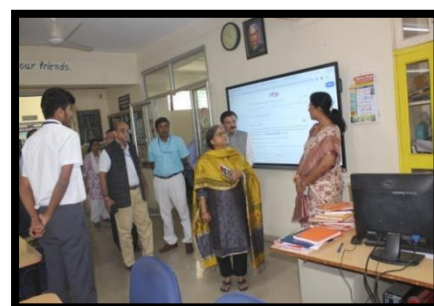
